Navajo weaving - Wikipedia In Navajo weaving, the slit weave technique common in kilims is not used, and the warp is one continuous length of yarn, not extending beyond the weaving as fringe. Traders from the late 19th and early 20th century encouraged adoption of some kilim motifs into Navajo designs. Navajo - Wikipedia Cheap blankets were imported, so Navajo weavers shifted their focus to weaving rugs for an increasingly non-Native audience. Rail service also brought in Germantown wool from Philadelphia , commercially dyed wool which greatly expanded the weavers' color palettes.

Three Southwest Weaving Cultures - University of Colorado ... Navajo weavers borrowed a number of design elements from the Spanish and then elaborated on them in their weaving. In 1863 the Navajo were incarcerated at the Bosque Redondo Reservation in eastern New Mexico. Their herds of churro sheep were destroyed, and the Navajo were issued commercial yarns and dyes. This design is recognized by Anglos as a swastika and caused great controversy in the late 1930s.
